<p>LeAF Studio receives a Pupil Premium Grant for each child who is entitled to receive Free School Meals or who has been entitled over the last six years, and for any looked after children.</p> <p>We are required to publish online information about how we have used the premium.</p> <p>The funding received from Pupil Premium has been allocated in the following ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Supporting learning through programmes delivered to individual or small groups for those children who need a boost to their learning in order to reach their potential; for example small group reading, writing or maths tuition; • Providing specialised resources for individuals and groups of students as recommended by specific agencies; • Increasing access for vulnerable children to engage in extra-curricular activities; • Supporting children’s learning in the classroom by ensuring that class sizes are as low as possible; • Ensuring that the children who qualify for free school meals have their needs clearly identified and their progress closely monitored through school; • Maintaining the parent support advisor role at two days per week to ensure provision of a range of support for children and families. 	
Curriculum focus of the Pupil Premium Grant spending for 2013-2014	
<p>The Studio has focussed its additional support on accelerating progress to ensure that children, who are eligible for the pupil premium, meet or exceed age related expectations in Literacy and Numeracy.</p>	
Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium Grant spending	
<p>Data collected from assessments in Summer term 2014 show that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is no significant difference at LeAF Studio between the performance of children eligible for PPG and those who are not; • 2014 across KS4 results show that there has been an improvement in student achievement for children eligible for PPG in comparison to 2013. Average point scores for this group of children have risen by 4.5 points in English and Maths (equating to more than two sub-levels);
